

COVID 19 – Updated March 26th 2020

As you know, the COVID19 pandemic is affecting worksites across Alberta. This includes Cold Lake Range Control (CRC) activities and access to the CLAWR.

As a result, a series of screening questions have been developed and are being administered at the Southgate access point of the CLAWR. If any occupants of the vehicle accessing the CLAWR answer yes to any of the questions, the entire vehicle will be prevented from entering the CLAWR. See questions below.

Additionally, these questions are posted outside the Southgate Orientation Facility (next to the gate) and the sign will direct individuals requiring Orientation services not to enter the facility if they answer yes to any of the questions. There are measures being implemented within the Southgate Orientation Facility that are focused on keeping CRC staff safe and limiting the spread of COVID19. Please ensure that anyone that is screened to enter the facility is directed to adhere to the new instructions once inside and have already taken the online CLAWR orientation course.

Questions

Have you returned from travel outside of Canada in the past 14 days?

Do you currently have a fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny nose or nasal congestion?

Have you had close contact with a person with an acute respiratory illness who has travelled outside of Canada within the last 14 days?

Have you had close contact with a confirmed or probable case of COVID-19, or been advised by Public Health that you're required to self-isolate as a close contact?

Are you a Health Care Provider? (If no, questions below will not be asked)

Are you a health care provider who has had contact with any confirmed or presumptive cases of COVID-19, and you **did not** have proper PPE maintained during the time you cared for them?

Are you a health care provider who has been identified by Public Health as close contact requiring self-isolation or monitoring for 14 days after a breach in the use of PPE?
