



## SAFETY ADVISORY

Dispose of your cigarette butts appropriately!



On average, over 1000 wildfires will occur throughout Alberta each year. Carelessly discarded cigarette butts are a frequent cause of fires. On April 16, 2019 the Alberta Forestry Representatives stated to Range Control, that current soil conditions are dry and grass fires are possible.

In recent years, Range Control has observed and received reports of people witnessing smokers throwing cigarette butts out of their truck windows while travelling on the Ken Baker Road.

You can help reduce the likelihood of destructive bushfires by disposing of your cigarette butts responsibly and making sure others do the same.

Make sure your butt is fully extinguished before disposing of it and remember to **never throw** your cigarette butt from a moving vehicle.
